An exciting opportunity exists for a casual, live-in Boarding House Supervisor to join our vibrant school community.

Working hours: Totalling 17.5 hours a week during school term.

Monday, Wednesday, Thursday: 6pm - 10pm, **Friday:** 7am - 8:30am and 6pm - 10pm. No work on Tuesday, Saturday and Sunday.

You are expected to stay in the boarding house overnight on the nights you are rostered on.

Accommodation: This is a live-in role and accommodation is provided year-round, not just on the nights you are rostered on. You will have your own room with ensuite, all meals (during term time), unlimited internet, all utilities, parking and laundry service included.

Remuneration: 16 hours in return for accommodation package described above. 1.5 hours paid at a standard rate with potential for paid overtime.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Actively supervise our boarding house students at all times
- Provide a positive, nurturing and homely environment to our boarding house students so that they can flourish at school
- Ensure that the students abide by the expectations of the College
- Assist with the smooth running of the boarding house
- Light housekeeping duties (Housekeeper attends to the majority)
- Provide care, as appropriate, for the boarders' overall well-being (e.g. physical, emotional, social, intellectual)
- Attend to any emergencies as appropriate
- Oversee / assist / tutor their studies as appropriate
- On occasion, you may be requested to accompany the students on excursions or other activities
- Model and instil appropriate behaviour, language, hygiene and grooming
- Foster the importance of personal responsibility, good habits and routines
- Embody and embed our College values of Humility, Honour, Passion, Commitment and Appreciation
- Inform the Head of Boarding about all matters relating to boarding students
